

What Does Social Change Look Like?

Facilitation Guide

- This is an adaptation of the Visual Explorer® exercise developed by the Center for Creative Leadership (<http://cclve.blogspot.com/>)
- Print each image on a separate sheet and display them around the room on the walls or on table surfaces (the number of images you display should equal the number of participants + about 5 or so)
- Explain that the goal of this exercise is to get people thinking and talking about their associations with the concept of “what social change looks like”
- Give participants a few minutes to walk around the room and choose an image that resonates with their idea of social change (encourage them not to spend too much time contemplating – they should choose something that grabs them immediately)
- Once each person has chosen an image, have them gather in pairs or in groups of 4 (depending on the size of the group) and talk about why they chose their image for about 10 minutes or so (timing will also depend on the size of the group)
- Have groups share out and record themes
